#### **Big Strokes for Little Folks**

Big Strokes for Little Folks is a remedial intervention program for students ages six through twelve who exhibit moderate to severe difficulties performing the following basic printing skills: entry-level letter formation, letter placement, spacing to form words and sentences writing without reversals.

#### Printing Like a Pro!

This program's aim is to help your student learn and remember the correct way to form each letter. This helps to make printing easier. This can also help to make printing neater and quicker. This printing program is for all types of learners in primary grades. It was, however, developed for students with motor learning problems.

This program uses specific strategies that include modeling, imitation, self-talk, and selfevaluation (these are cognitive-based strategies). I is recommended the student works on this program 20 Minutes, thre to five times a week may help your student learn correct letter formation. This regular teaching will hopefully help to prevent or correct "bad habits".
