#### **Reading Buddies**

Target Audience: Children in grades 1-6 who are at least one reading level behind. Students will meet individually with a reading tutor once a week for 30 minutes. Students in Grade 1-3 will have the opportunity to meet with a Program Facilitator twice a week on Tuesdays and Wednesdays at 6 pm in a group session focusing on growth

mindset skills, social and emotional learning and mindfulness which are important skills when learning to read.

#### Tech Next Step (Laptop)

Program participants: students in grades 3-6 within the public board who have received prior SEA training on their laptop devices. For students participating in this program, they will require a laptop, Office365 ONLINE login (public board login), and a headset with an attached microphone. Prior to enrolling, please confirm that the student has successfully logged into Office365 Online since September 2021 (or current school year) At the end of the program, students will have covered Word, PowerPoint, OneDrive, OneNote, Equatio, WordQ, and their respective features to better use their SEA claim laptop in school. Additionally, the topics of internet researching and online safety will be discussed. (6-week session)

Target Audience: Students in the Public school board in grades 3-6 who have received SEA training on their laptop devices Cost:

#### SET (Supported Employment Training)

Participants will develop resumes, complete mock interviews, develop job search techniques, and develop critical workplace skills such as effective communication, time management, accepting criticism, dealing with anger, and working as part of a team. Participants will become aware of how learning disabilities and ADHD affect all aspects of their lives and will determine their strengths, weaknesses and specific strategies to succeed in an interview and on the job.
