Reporting to the Program Manager, the Speech Language Pathologist acts as part of a multi-disciplinary team, to provide support to children and youth to develop and maintain functional communication and/or feeding/swallowing skills during daily activities.

The Speech Language Pathologist will provide clinical services within their professional scope of practice including assessment, treatment planning and implementation, and documentation. They will provide comprehensive clinical services within the Centre, as well as within homes and schools in the community. They will collaborate with clients/families and other team members in the planning and delivery of treatment, programs, and services to address the following areas: feeding/swallowing, language, articulation, fluency, and voice.

Qualifications:

The candidate must have a Master's degree in Communication Disorders and Sciences, from a recognized university; they must be a licensed and registered member in good standing with CASLPO; and they must demonstrate professional competencies in accordance with college requirements and legislation. Previous experience in a pediatric setting is preferred. The candidate must be able to work successfully in a family-centred, and team environment.

The qualified candidate must have strong interpersonal, communication, and organizational skills; must be able to work independently, and as part of a multi-disciplinary team. The candidate must be available to work flexible hours, as required.
