






A little boy named Todd was born in 1967 to Brad and Joanne Stannard. He had some physical disabilities and his mom drove him to The Red Cross school everyday in Windsor from Kingsville. Sadly, he passed away when he had just turned 8. Brad and Joanne continued their connection with this school, which through several transitions eventually became the John McGivney Children's Centre (JMCC). Brad's favourite dessert was pie and Joanne inherited the family skills of making delicious pies. Brad, as a member of the Harrow Fair board, was very sad to see the judged pies being discarded, and so the pie auction began. The plan was that the money raised would go to JMCC. In 2000, the auction raised over \$3,000, which was a hefty amount for a pie with a piece missing! In 2019, over \$32,000 was raised. Approximately 70 prize winning pies are auctioned off each year. Over the 24 years since the pie auction began, over \$200,000 has been

raised for JMCC. After Joanne passed away in 2010 and Brad passed away in 2014, the auction continued with their son and daughter-in-law taking over, along with members of the Harrow Fair board. We thank those who have purchased pies over the years to benefit JMCC.
