- Represent JMCC to members of the communities we serve
- Commit time as required to fulfill the responsibilities of a Board Member
- Board Members hold office for two consecutive terms of three years

Our Services

The John McGivney Children's Centre (JMCC) provides a variety of services to approximately 4,000 children & youth in Windsor-Essex County each year. We believe that our services and programs can and will make a difference in the quality of life of our clients and will provide them the opportunity to develop to their full potential. Our services are provided to our clients at the Centre, in their homes, virtually, and in community schools and serve children from birth to 21 years of age with one or more of the following:

- Neurological conditions (e.g. cerebral palsy and head injury)
- Birth Defects (e.g. Spina Bifida)
- Muscle disorders (e.g. Muscular Dystrophy)
- Trauma (e.g. fractures, post-surgical)
- Illness (e.g. cancer)
- Unusual metabolic conditions
- Cardiovascular and respiratory conditions
- Cleft lip and/or palate craniofacial conditions
- Autism
- Orthopedic/musculoskeletal conditions
- Genetic disorders (e.g. Down Syndrome)
- Developmental delays

Specialized therapies and services include physiotherapy, occupational therapy, communication therapy, social work, augmentative communication therapy and seating/mobility.
